We also aim to train researchers, physicians, and advanced specialists who will further the science and practice of medicine with a strong moral compass and a passion for learning under the Keio motto of independence and self-respect.

2. Enrollment

April 2019 Enrollment

1. Major in Medical Sciences

Admission Capacity: 72 students

Aim: The Major in Medical Sciences is designed for graduates of a 6-year medical, dentistry, veterinary, or pharmacy school; as well as graduates of a master's degree program. The goal of the Major in Medical Sciences is to train students to conduct creative research in the fields of basic medical science and clinical medicine as well as research into the mechanisms of disease and the development of new therapeutic approaches.

2. Major in Applied Medicine

Admission Capacity: 8 students

Aim: The Major in Applied Medicine is designed mainly for practicing physicians and other medical professionals. The goal of the Major in Applied Medicine is to guide students in using their clinical knowledge and analytical skills to plan and conduct comprehensive clinical trials and interdisciplinary research, especially in the fields of oncology and cardiology.

*Applicants for the Applied Medicine Specialty are expected to have high level of Japanese language proficiency as all lectures are conducted in Japanese.

September 2019 Enrollment

1. Major in Medical Sciences

Admission Capacity: Not Determined

Aim: The Major in Medical Sciences is designed for graduates of a 6-year medical, dentistry, veterinary, or pharmacy school; as well as graduates of a master's degree program. The goal of the Medical Sciences is to train students to conduct creative research in the fields of basic medical science and clinical medicine as well as research into the mechanisms of disease and the development of new therapeutic approaches.

3. Eligibility

April 2019 Enrollment

1. Applicants who have completed or expect to complete 18 years of full-time education majoring in Medicine, Dentistry, Veterinary Medicine, or Pharmacy at the university level by March 31, 2019.
2. Applicants who have completed or expect to complete a Master's program in a relevant field by March 31, 2019.
3. Applicants who have completed 16 years of full-time education and have afterwards completed at least two years of research at a university or research institution. Such applicants' research must be of equal or higher quality than that of graduates who majored in Medicine, Dentistry, Veterinary Medicine, or Pharmacy at a Japanese university.
4. Applicants who have been determined by Keio University to be as capable as those who have completed an undergraduate program majoring in Medicine, Dentistry, Pharmacology, or Veterinary Medicine.

Note:

Applicants must contact the Office of Student Services by e-mail to confirm their eligibility at least a month prior to each application period.

5. Application Process

Step1: Web Entry for Online Application

Applicants must complete their web entry during the prescribed period and submit the completed web entry page by post with the other application documents.

***If applications are sent from within Japan, they should be sent by simple-registered, express mail (*kan'i-kakitome sokutatsu* [簡易書留速達]) and must be postmarked on or before the last day of the application period.**

***If applications are sent from overseas, they should be sent by a method that allows tracking, such as EMS and couriers (e.g. FedEx, DHL etc.), and they must arrive on or before the last day of the application period.**

1. A copy of the completed web entry page
2. Application form (4 pages) with signature and seal of the professor who will be the applicant's research supervisor at Keio University (if you cannot obtain the professor's signature and seal, please attach his/her letter of consent)
3. Research plan
4. A reference written by the applicant's current academic supervisor or someone who has previously supervised the applicant's studies
5. Certificate of graduation or statement of expected graduation from undergraduate and/or master's program
6. Academic transcripts for undergraduate and/or master's program
7. Application card
8. Two photos taken within the last three months (these should be pasted onto the application form and application card)
 - Print size H: 40 mm x W: 30mm
 - Face and shoulders, directly facing the camera
 - Plain background
9. Proof of payment of the application fee: applicants should print out the 'Application Completed' page when they have completed online payment by credit card
10. List of Achievements (optional): It may be written in any format. Please write in chronological order.

*If documents in a language other than Japanese or English are to be submitted, they must be translated into Japanese or English. The translation must be certified by a public institution such as the university or graduate school you graduated from, an embassy, etc., to verify there are no discrepancies between the original and the translation. Submit the original and the certified translation.

Important Notes

1. After the application has been officially processed, an examination slip with application number will be sent to the applicant by e-mail. This should be printed and carried by the applicant on the examination day. If you do not receive it by September 3, 2018(Term A)/December 25, 2018(Term B), contact Office of Student Services, Keio University Shinanomachi Campus by e-mail.
2. Incomplete applications and applications arrived after the application deadline will not be accepted.
3. If any information on the application documents is incorrect or fraudulent, the eligibility of application and admission will be cancelled.
4. Application forms, documents, and fees paid cannot be returned or refunded.

6-2. Important Notes on the Examination

1. Examination Slip

- a. Bring your examination slip on the day of the examination.
- b. If you forget to bring or lose your examination slip on the day of the examination, contact the university staff upon arrival at the examination venue.

2. Examination Venue

- a. Doors to the examination venue will open 30 minutes before the seating time.
- b. Applicants are expected to arrive at the examination venue at least 10 minutes before the examination starts.

3. Written Examination

- a. In the examination venue, follow directions of the proctor.
- b. When writing answers, please use a HB/B pencil or a mechanical pencil. You may also use a black or blue ink ballpoint pen.
- c. During the examination period, you may only place the following items on the desk: examination slip, writing instruments, erasers, pencil sharpeners (excluding electric type), watches/clocks (smartwatches are prohibited), and glasses.
- d. Turn off your mobile phone and any other communication devices. Put them away and do not use them.
- e. If you wish to use handkerchief, tissue, eye drops, nasal spray, and any other medication during the examination for health reasons, please raise your hand and inform the proctor.
- f. Use of earplugs is not allowed during the examination as you may not be able to hear the directions of the proctor.
- g. Actions that may disturb other applicants are prohibited in the examination venue.
- h. Leaving the examination venue during the examination is not permitted. However, inform the proctor if you feel ill or need to use a bathroom.
- i. In the event that an act of misconduct, dishonesty, or cheating is identified during the examination, you may be required to leave the examination venue.
- j. Write your answers within the designated space on the answer sheet, and do not write on other areas. Your answer sheet will not be reissued.

4. Other Notes

- a. If it is deemed difficult to conduct the examination on the dates previously announced due to unforeseen circumstances, Keio University may decide to postpone the entrance examination or take other actions. Keio University, in principle, is not accountable for any personal loss and inconveniences incurred to individual applicants following the above decision.
